6 Purple Haze lease for sale

It has come as no great surprise, nor are we unduly alarmed though we could all question the timing, to learn that the lease for the Purple Haze site and adjoining land in Dorset has been put up for sale by the Somerley Estate.

Advice from industry experts who are campaign supporters is that the sale is a normal commercial activity of little cost to the Estate which could be interpreted as Somerley simply testing the waters ahead of any decision by the Hampshire Authorities.

We also believe it means that Somerley are unlikely to have a preferred operator lined up and ready to go should Purple Haze remain in Hampshire's Plan.

Where we can all draw our own conclusions – and we have to say this before you all remind us – is around the erection of the substantial transformer alongside the B3081 and next to the Purple Haze site. Was it really to service an estate property or good planning and/or a major presumption ahead of Hampshire's decision? We may never know.

We shall certainly follow up on the implications of the offer by the Somerley Estate of the use of Dorset land to Dorset County Council (DCC). We appreciate, however, that this is also usual commercial practice and so we are not alarmed it has happened. We also know that DCC will be legally obliged to consider Somerley's offer as part of developing their minerals/waste plan.

We shall, however, have to see how valid earlier statements prove to be that DCC won't locate a minerals site "near to Verwood". For now, and until we have the information we have yet to request from DCC, the outcome of Hampshire developing their Minerals & Waste Plan and the fate of Purple Haze in particular is our primary concern.
